123. To ensure transparency and accountability, will the NSW Treasury commit to clearly stated Budget line items in the 2024-25 Budget Papers to ensure spending on domestic and family violence prevention and response in NSW can be tracked?

Gambling Revenue

124. Specifically, what are the formulas and assumptions used by Treasury when forecasting gambling tax revenue, given each category of gambling tax is forecast to rise by different percentages over the forward estimates?

125. Please list how much betting revenue the state government received from the greyhound racing industry for each of the last four financial years and for each of those years please advise

(a) What were the total funds expended by the government (or other agencies/third parties on its behalf) during that period on gambling harm reduction and minimisation?

(b) What were the total funds expended by the government in that period in support of the greyhound racing industry and please detail each major type of expenditure, e.g., track infrastructure, government inquiries into the industry, breeding incentives, prize money contributions, advertising, sponsorship, etc?

(c) How much betting revenue did the state government receive from the greyhound racing industry if the total sums listed for a. and b. are subtracted?

(d) If any of the above requested data is unavailable, please explain why.

126. What is the Treasury's independent estimate of the economic value of the NSW greyhound racing industry? Please advise the method and data sources used to determine this value.

127. The 2022/23 budget indicated that the point of consumption tax would increase to 15% for online betting from 10%, has this been reversed?

128. Please explain the \$88 million dollar disparity between the racing revenue forecast in the previous budget and the actual revenue recorded for 2022-23.

129. Please explain the increasing year on year disparity between the revenue forecast in the 2022-23 Budget and that recorded in the 2023-24 Budget.
